By bringing together on-the-job, on campus and online learning, Te Pūkenga is creating a network that gives learners more choices and flexibility in what, where and how they learn.



It's my pleasure to be able to provide an introduction in this 2024 prospectus and welcome you to Te Pūkenga, nei te reo rāhiri e rere atu ana – nau piki mai, nau kake mai ki Te Pūkenga.

In 2020, the government reviewed the vocational education system in Aotearoa New Zealand and made some significant changes for how it would work in the future.

One of those changes was the creation of Te Pūkenga, New Zealand Institute of Skills and Technology. The change meant that all of the country's Kura Tini, Institutes of Technology and Polytechnics such as Wintec as well as some of the country's Industry Training Organisations which focus on work-based learning such as apprenticeships, will now sit within one organisation – Te Pūkenga.

By bringing these organisations together, it means we can create a national network of on-the-job, on campus and online learning opportunities that give learners more choice and flexibility in what, where and how they learn throughout Aotearoa New Zealand.

For those of you thinking of enrolling with Wintec for study in 2024, this means you are going to be enrolling with a national organisation and you will receive a qualification from Aotearoa New Zealand's largest education provider, Te Pūkenga.

You'll still be able to study in the Waikato but you'll have the additional benefits that come from being part of a national network – such as more support, more study options and increased ability to switch between different types of learning if your circumstances change.

A national network means we can plan better for the future needs of Aotearoa. We want to make sure that when you enrol in a programme, you are gaining skills that are needed by Aotearoa and around the world – giving you more job security and ultimately increasing your opportunities for success.

Our transformation is a journey that will take time but one thing is clear, everything we do is centred around our learners and their whānau. We have a relentless focus of equity and we're setting the foundations to deliver to Te Tiriti o Waitangi and its principles, and most importantly to the aspirations of Māori learners, their whānau, and iwi/hapū.

Throughout this prospectus you may notice that a number of programmes are changing.

We are unifying programmes to make sure they are consistent across the country. This means if your circumstances change, you'll be able to continue with your study rather than having to start again. It's just one of the ways we are working to make learning fit around life, rather than making life fit around learning.

Ngā Kaupapa ako o Te Pūkenga o Waikato | Study options for secondary school students

We offer various resources and programmes to help you make the big decisions.

Waikato Trades Academy (WTA)

The Waikato Trades Academy (WTA) is funded by the government to provide secondary students with the opportunity to study at both school and Wintec.

As a WTA student, you can enrol in one of the programmes that WTA provides. This is an addition to your current school subject choice. You travel to the Wintec campuses for practical, hands-on learning, typically one day a week.

Secondary Tertiary Alignment Resource (STAR)

A STAR taster course is perfect if you are a secondary student considering your post-school options.

STAR courses are available for Year 10 to Year 13 students. These courses aim to showcase a specific career or qualification and are typically one day long (but may be up to five in some instances). You may be able to earn Unit Standards when completing a STAR course. There is a range of courses available.

Ō mātou whare wānanga | Our campuses

You will be based at one of our three campuses in Hamilton or one of our regional locations around Waikato.

Hamilton City Campus

The historic City Campus offers easy access to food outlets, retail shops, the Waikato River, Lake Rotoroa, and public transport. Highlights of the Campus include the Gallagher Hub, Atrium, and Te Kōpū Mānia o Kirikiriroa (the Wintec Marae). Nursing, health, education, business, IT and media arts are some of the programmes taught here.

Hamilton Rotokauri Campus

Our Rotokauri Campus, located in the northwestern part of Hamilton, has purpose-built facilities and plenty of green space. The Campus includes a library, basketball court and a café. Programmes taught here include sport science, trades, engineering, animal technology and hospitality.

Hamilton Gardens Campus

The world-class Hamilton Gardens are home to our third Hamilton-based campus. Arboriculture, horticulture, and landscape design and construction are based at this location.

Te Kete Manaaki Student Support Services

We understand that balancing your studies with commitments around whānau, work and everyday life can be challenging. Whether you need advice, study assistance or a warm and inviting space to relax, you will find it at Te Kete Manaaki in the City and Rotokauri hubs. Here you will find our student support teams, including Kaiāwhina, Manaaki Ākonga – Student Accessibility Services, Manaaki Pūkenga – Academic Learning Advisors and Āniwaniwa Alliance.

Māori and Pacific best practices and cultural values underpin how all our support teams work. We focus on a holistic approach that acknowledges a person's physical, spiritual, mental and whānau dynamics.

Our goal is to ensure our learning environments, student support initiatives, and teaching and learning practices meet the educational needs of all learners.

Kaiāwhina

Our kaiāwhina are often the first point of contact for those needing a friendly face to help navigate their way around. We know that studying can be overwhelming for many. There are a lot of processes and services that you may need to navigate, even before your classes start. Kaiāwhina are based at the City and Rotokauri campuses and work closely with our teaching staff. They can connect you to a range of support services available and host fun events and activities throughout the year.

Manaaki Pūkenga - Academic Learning Advisors

Give yourself the best chance of success with the help of our Manaaki Pūkenga – Academic Learning Advisors. Our team works alongside learners to support their success and can assist across many academic topics: writing, critical thinking, research, and study skills. They can support you in class, help coordinate group study sessions, and connect you with like-minded students.

Manaaki Ākonga - Student Accessibility Services

Our Manaaki Ākonga - Student Accessibility Services are here to enable academic capabilities by supporting anyone who may experience any barrier to fully accessing their studies due to an impairment or disability. We work with all areas of Wintec to provide inclusive support systems and build independence and opportunities for students.

International students

Studying away from your home country is an exciting opportunity, and we want to make it as easy for you as possible. Our International team will support you as you settle into your new learning environment and the wider community. They can

assist you in finding somewhere to live, help you understand New Zealand's culture and customs, and offer pastoral care and support.

Āniwaniwa Alliance

The Āniwaniwa Alliance supports our LGBTTQIA+ community. They work with different teams across Wintec to raise awareness, advocate and create visibility for our rainbow whānau to make Wintec a safe space. We are proud to have gained the Rainbow Tick in 2023.

Health Services

Our on-campus Health Services are available to assist and support you with your physical and mental wellbeing while studying. We welcome you to enrol at one of our centres at the City or Rotokauri campuses. Our clinics are nurse-led, meaning they are specially trained to provide you with a level of high care, with doctors available by appointment. We offer a range of services, such as:

- · General medical services
- Treatment for accidents/illness/injury
- · Sex information, advice and prescriptions
- · Womens health
- Melanoma checks
- · Minor surgical procedures
- Prescriptions
- Laboratory and blood tests

Counselling

Our Counselling team provide students with short-term counselling support. This could mean support for matters that are affecting your studies, such as stress, anxiety, life challenges, whānau dynamics, relationships, sexuality and mental health. Chaplaincy

We have an ecumenical chaplain and a Catholic chaplain to support and encourage you during your journey here. Regardless of your background or beliefs, they are available for support to help you with any spiritual or religious questions you may have and provide a listening ear and a safe place to talk to, even when you just need a chat or coffee.

Multi-faith rooms

Prayer rooms with wash facilities are available at the City and Rotokauri campuses.

Library

There are on-site libraries at the City and Rotokauri campuses. You can access many resources online, including a broad range of specialist databases and eBooks. Our library staff can help you find useful resources; you can book one-to-one drop-in sessions and contact them via email for assistance. If you are studying by distance learning, you can get material sent directly to your door.

Computer access

The Gallagher Hub at the City Campus has computers for you to use 24-hours-a-day, seven days a week. The Hub at the Rotokauri Campus also provides computers for you to use during regular daytime hours. The City and Rotokauri campuses have high-speed wireless internet, so you can bring your device to classes. Both campuses have laptop dispensers where you can access a loan laptop to use around the campus (including in class) for up to four hours. You can also access the Information Technology Services (ITS) Helpdesk, with staff available to help you with a wide range of IT-related issues, such as computer accounts and Moodle.

What is Design Factory NZ?

Design Factory NZ is part of the Design Factory Global Network, a group of innovation hubs in institutes across the globe. The purpose of Design Factory NZ is to drive effective problem-solving. It provides a unique learning experience with a focus on teaching innovation and Design Thinking.

What is the value of this type of study?

The Design Factory NZ experience reflects the modern-day workplace, where employees from various teams, jobs and disciplines often work cross-functionally to solve organisational, social and business challenges. The skills and processes learned mean that no matter whether you are planning on being an engineer, graphic designer, social worker or sports scientist, you will be able to add value in your workplace as an innovative, solutions-focused leader.

What do the courses involve?

You will learn to combine your diverse experiences to solve real-world problems. In the level 7 module, this problem is provided by an industry partner

- a business or organisation that has a genuine challenge or problem to resolve. Working together with them, you will co-create a solution to their challenge. This industry engagement provides you with opportunities to build your communication skills and strong industry networks, while still studying at Wintec. The level 6 module focuses on design thinking tools and strategy.

Where is it based?

Learners are in the dedicated, co-creation Design Factory NZ space at the Hamilton City Campus.

Who can apply?

The Design Factory NZ 15 or 30-credit module is currently available to second or third-year students working towards degrees in business, sport science, IT, engineering, social work, counselling, science and media arts (communications, design, performing arts, contemporary art). 

Qualification levels

The New Zealand Qualifications Framework (NZQF) is comprised of ten levels and covers a range of qualifications from certificates to doctoral degrees. The levels are based on how complex the learning is; with one being the most basic, through to ten being the most complex.



Entry requirements

Every course has a set of entry criteria. These criteria are designed to ensure the programme's complexity level fits your experience and knowledge base.

How you gain entry may be based on what you completed at school, on-the-job experience or previous tertiary education.

Foundation courses are available if you do not meet the requirements for entry.

Entry based on secondary school achievement

Entry requires you to complete your study at a New Zealand secondary school, through NCEA or the prior system (such as School Certificate).

Entry based on tertiary study achievement

Entry is gained based on what you have already studied within a tertiary environment.

On-the-job experience

Entry is gained based on your work experience. It

acknowledges the relevant knowledge, skills, and expertise that will help you be successful in the programme.

Discretionary entrance

If you do not meet any of the above but think you have what it takes to complete a programme, you can apply for discretionary entrance. Your application may be accepted if you can demonstrate a good chance of success.

The relevant manager within each centre is responsible for approving discretionary entrance requests. Please note that if your application is approved, any further study beyond the programme you are initially approved for may require you to demonstrate a strong chance of success.

English language requirements

These requirements are outlined on the web page of each course and are designed to ensure you have the right level of English competency to meet the programme's needs.



Our programmes

We offer a range of degrees, pathways and programmes, that have been created with academic and business experts for the purpose of making you an employable graduate. Additionally, our programmes are tailored to the specific needs of international students. Classes are taught in English, but there are staff available who speak other languages if you need some extra support.

Foundation

Foundation courses are ideal for people who want to enhance their employment and study opportunities.

They are suitable if you do not meet the entry requirements for a specific programme or have been out of study for a long time. You will graduate ready to progress straight into your next programme with the confidence to use the skills you have developed.

New Zealand Certificate in Study and Career Preparation (Level 4)

Full-time: One semester Part-time options available



Start dates: February or July

If you wish to pursue tertiary study, but need to build confidence or study skills, this programme is perfect for you. You will choose from one of five pathways that align with your study and career goals: health, social services, ECE, creative industries, or the open pathway (for general subjects). You will gain essential academic knowledge, capabilities and skills needed to succeed at higher levels of study.

As a graduate, you may be able to progress to further study in the following areas: nursing, midwifery, occupational therapy, physiotherapy, sport science, social work and counselling programmes, early childhood education, design, communication, visual art, music composition production and performance, and others.

Basic Computing - SPACE (Self-Paced Applied Computer Education)



Hamilton City Campus or regional locations



Full-time: One semester Part-time options available



Start dates: Rolling

Learn basic computing skills such as general keyboard use and increasing your typing speed. You will also learn how to access the internet and use email.

The course also covers many Microsoft Office programmes, including PowerPoint, Word, Publisher



and Excel, which will help you:

- Create, edit, format and print documents such as letters, memos and CVs.
- Combine text and graphics to produce documents used for advertising and publishing.
- Create publications designed for both printing and the web.
- Work with numbers on a spreadsheet, replacing the need to use a pen, paper and calculator.
- Create presentations across slides, print audience handouts, outlines and speaker notes.

You will choose an area of focus and undertake a practicum (200 hours) relevant to your selected area.

There are many career opportunities depending on your area of focus. As a graduate, you may work in residential care, community development, social justice advocacy, mental health and addictions support, or go on to higher-level study.



This programme introduces new dairy manufacturing areas for those employed within the industry and is relevant to those in manufacturing, laboratory, quality, logistics, technical, or other relevant areas. You will develop technical skills and knowledge in processing management, production and manufacturing technologies, which is a pathway to career advancement.

As a graduate, you may go on to work within the manufacturing sector as a supervisor of other staff who can manage a production run unsupervised. You may go on to more senior levels of management within the industry.

New Zealand Certificate in Animal Technology (Level 5) with strands in Rural Animal Technician

Start dates: February

If you are seeking a job in a veterinary-related field, working with rural animals, this practical programme is suited to you. It includes a minimum of 240 hours of industry placement.






